

The South Central Kentucky Cultural Center is dedicated to telling the story of the people, places and events that make up the geographic area known as the "Barrens" - Metcalfe, Allen, Hart and Monroe Counties, as well as Barren County. Housed in the old Kentucky Pants factory in downtown Glasgow, the center - also known as the Museum of the Barrens - is 30,000 square feet packed with area history. Visitors can travel all the way back to 12,000 B.C.; also included are tools and firearms, a log cabin, and a gristmill from the mid - 1800's. Other attractions include an extensive military exhibit starting with the Civil War, a doll collection, a one-room schoolhouse and the town square as it looked at the turn of the century.

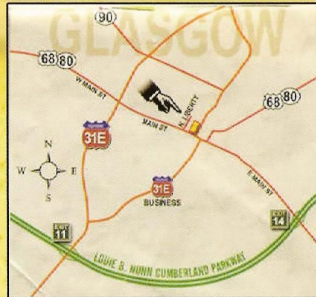

 Turn Right into OUR PARKING LOT

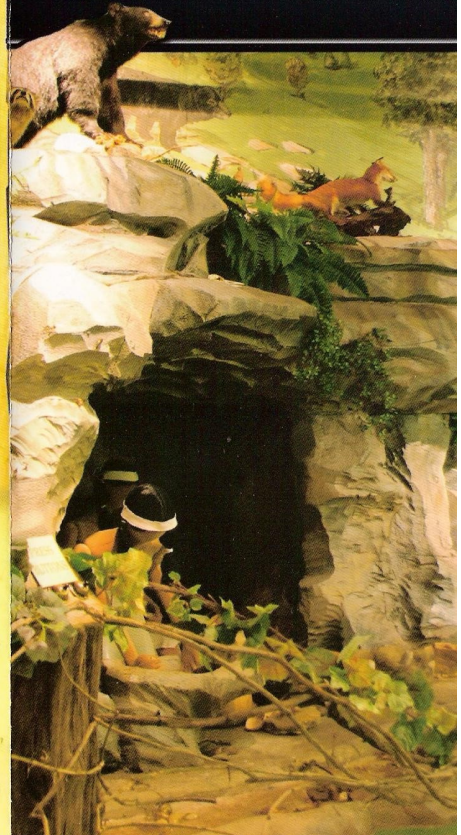
